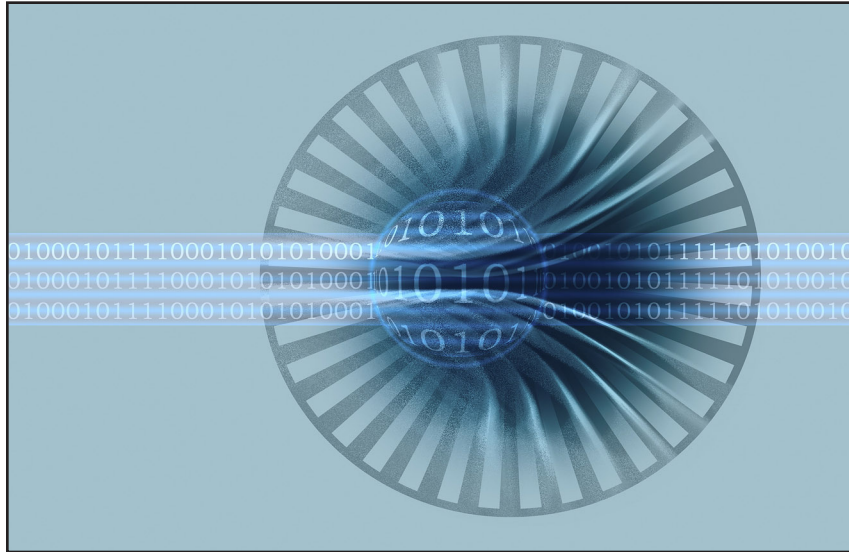


Barnes Aerospace flies high using IBM and Corente to ensure on demand application delivery
